On the occasion of <u>the European Lawyers' Day 2021</u> which theme is "No justice without independent lawyers", the CCBE is organising a Roundtable to discuss the topic of a future European Convention on the profession of lawyer. Based on the findings of the <u>feasibility study</u> on "a new, binding or nonbinding, European legal instrument on the profession of lawyer - Possible added-value and effectiveness" which was prepared by Jeremy MacBride under the auspice of the European Committee on Legal Co-operation (CDCJ), the aim of this Roundtable is to bring together representatives of the Council of Europe and representatives of lawyers' organisations to discuss the need for a European Convention on the legal profession, the content of such a binding instrument, as well as the system for its implementation in order to prepare for the work of the future expert group of the CDCJ on a future legal instrument on the profession of lawyers.
