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# Lawyers' training curriculum in EU Law



Co-funded by the European Union



The **Council of Bars and Law Societies of Europe (CCBE)** and the **European Lawyers Foundation (ELF)** have produced an EU law curriculum for practising EU lawyers, as part of the BREULAW project, co-funded by the **European Union**.

This curriculum is unique and of great value to **EU bars and law societies and institutions** which train **EU lawyers**, because of its special features:

- ✓ it is targeted at the needs of practising lawyers in their **daily work**, rather than being a purely academic curriculum;
- ✓ its focus is on the **practical and procedural aspects of EU law** which are not already widely taught and where a gap in legal education is seen – for instance, apart from a strong focus on remedies and procedures, there is coverage of various EU-wide registries (business, insolvency and land), and there is a separate section on EU law relating specifically to lawyers;
- ✓ its level is aimed at use as part of the initial or qualifying training of lawyers, although it is also able to be adapted to continuing legal education courses; and
- ✓ it features many **practical guides produced by various authoritative European bodies**: the CCBE, the EU itself (through the e-Justice portal), the Council of Europe, and the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) and the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR).
